

Want to Obtain an AALAS Certification? Here's How:

Technician Certification



The AALAS Technician Certification Program sets professional standards for the advancement of laboratory animal science. This program was developed to recognize professional achievement and provide an authoritative endorsement of a technician's level of knowledge in laboratory animal technology.

AALAS certifies technicians at three levels:

- Assistant Laboratory Animal Technician (ALAT)
- · Laboratory Animal Technician (LAT)
- Laboratory Animal Technologist (LATG)

The technician certification designations of ALAT, LAT, and LATG are well known and widely used throughout the varied fields of laboratory animal care. In fact, these certifications have come to be a common requirement for a lab animal care position.

Steps to take the Exam:

- Fill out an application here:
 https://www.aalas.org/certification
 on/technician-certification
- Submit your application with everything filled out and all required documents.
- You will receive an email containg your authorization to test letter and instructions to set up a Prometric testing date and time. This must be done within 90 days of receiving the email.
- Study up and prepare for the level you are trying to attain.

- You will know if you Pass/Fail as soon as you finish the exam and will be given a printout of proof and an email confirmation to give your workplace.
- Your certificate will be sent out and delivered to your house about 2 weeks later.


